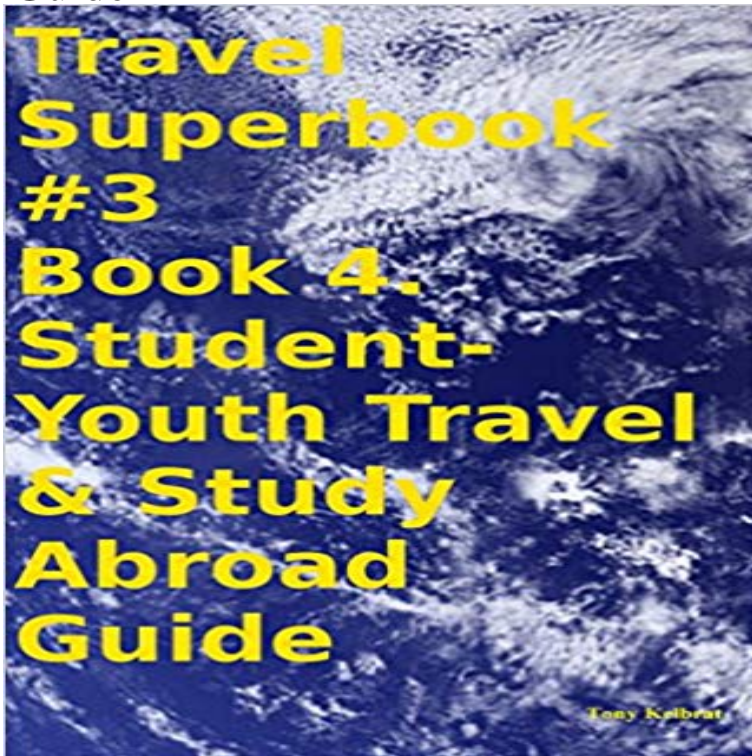


Travel Superbook #3 Book 4. Student-Youth Travel & Study Abroad Guide
