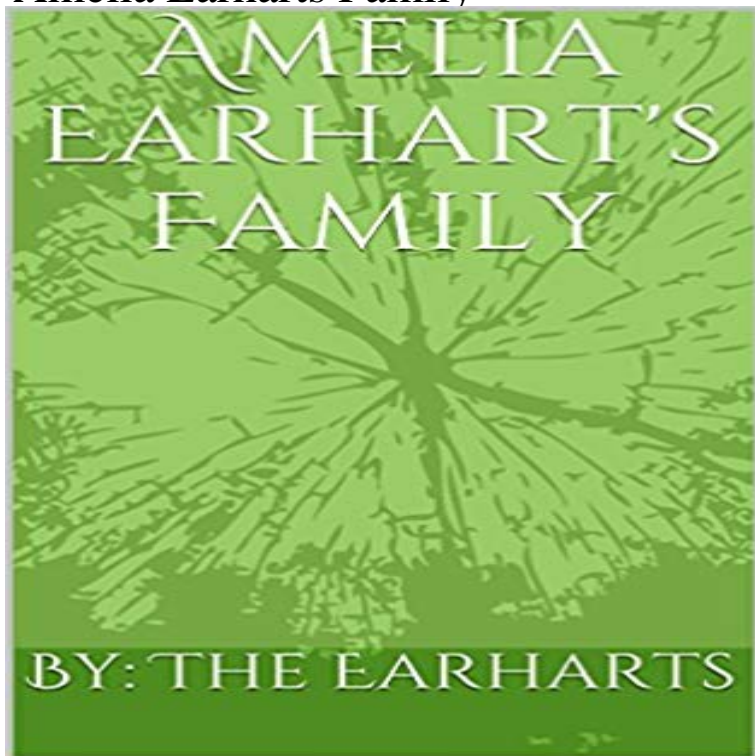


## Amelia Earharts Family
