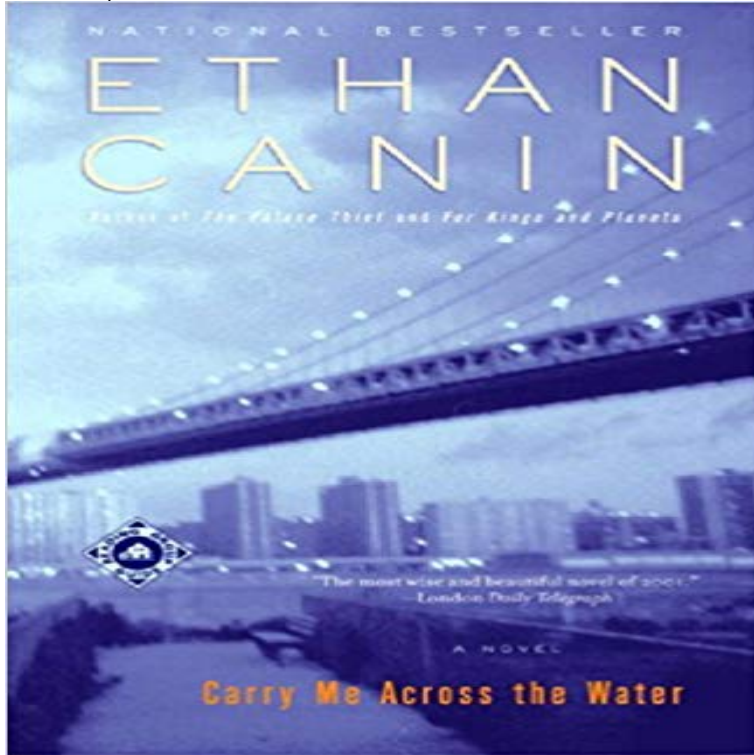


Carry Me Across the Water: A Novel
