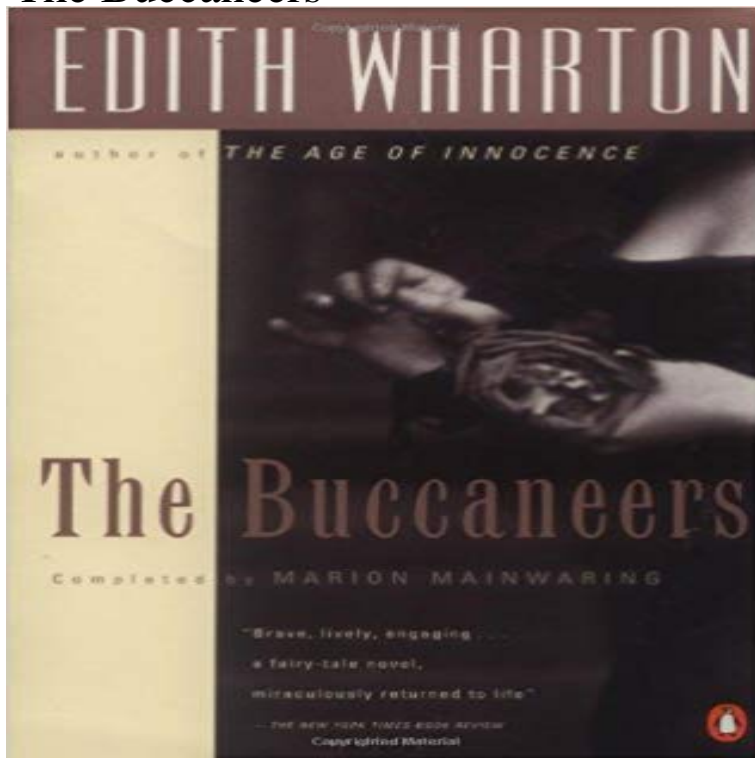


# The Buccaneers

After Wharton's death in 1937, *The Christian Science Monitor* said, "If it could have been completed, *The Buccaneers* would doubtless stand among the richest and most sophisticated of Wharton's novels."
