From Addergey hither, salt is the current money, in large purchases, such as sheep or other cattle: cohol, and pepper, for smaller articles such as flour, butter, fowls, &c. They began to find the price of provisions augment in a great proportion as they approached the capital. Early on the 14th they continued their journey, and in ten minutes time had five villages of Tamamo three miles on their left: their road was through gentle rising hills, all pasture ground. At half-past seven, the village of Woggora was three miles on their right, and at eight, the church of St. George a mile on their left, with a village of the same name ...
