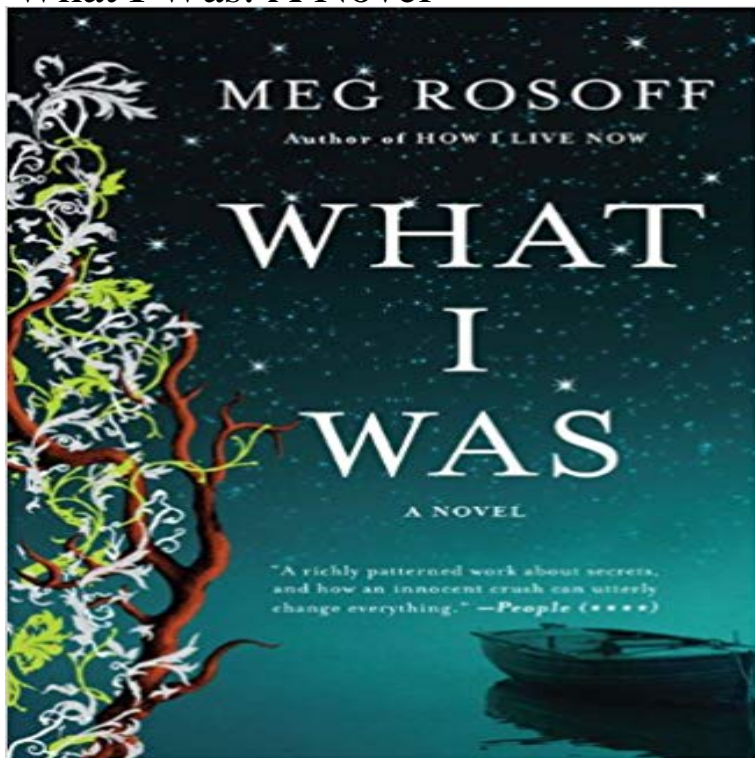


## What I Was: A Novel
