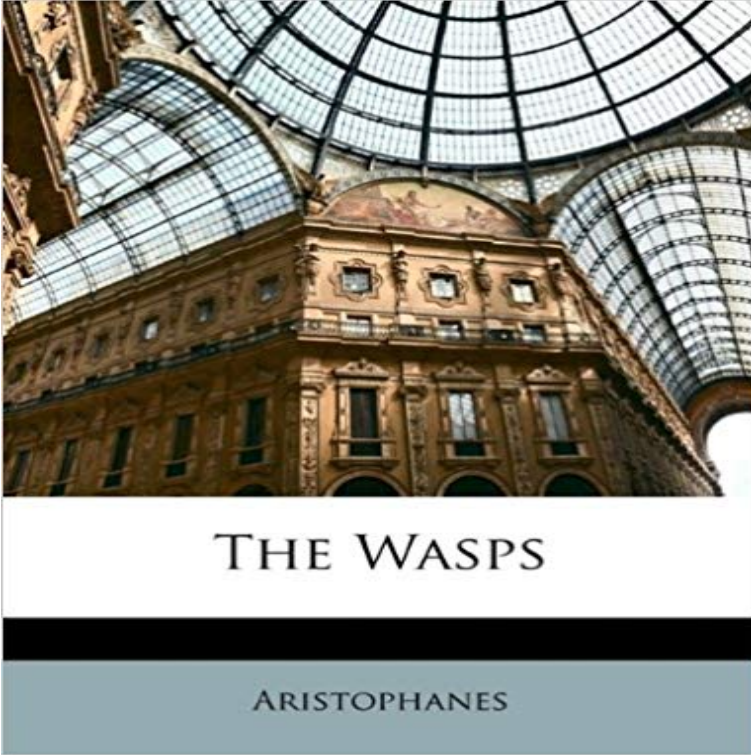


The Wasps (Ancient Greek Edition)
